MEET SINFONIA VIVA

Established in 1982, Sinfonia Viva is the professional orchestra of the East Midlands.

From our headquarters in Derby, we achieve regional and national reach through concerts and creative community projects, delivering thrilling in-person experiences and meaningful digital resources.

Innovation, participation and collaboration permeate everything we do, driven by our vision of a world where all communities are inspired through music.

We are proud to work in spaces big and small, urban and rural. We give full-scale chamber orchestra performances in concert halls, cathedrals and parks, while bringing our string orchestra and smaller-scale ensembles to intimate venues and community spaces.

Our award-winning creative projects enjoy national recognition. We regularly deliver projects in Essex, East Yorkshire, Norfolk and Suffolk in addition to our East Midlands programme. All our programmes, whether for the elderly, asylum seekers or children, take a collaborative approach to creation, with deep, considered involvement from our musicians.

In the 2025/26 season, we gave over 20 concerts in local venues including Nottingham's Royal Concert Hall and Derby Cathedral. These included six relaxed performances for those living with dementia, and two family concerts. Meanwhile, we delivered more than 220 creative workshops and community-focused activities, with over 10,000 engagements from children, young people, carers, older people, hospital patients, refugees and community groups.

In 2019, we were honoured to have the word-famous (Nottingham-based!) Kanneh-Mason family become our Patrons. So far, Isata, Jeneba, Konya, Braimah and Sheku have all joined us in concert as soloists, to great acclaim. Mother and author Kadiatu Kanneh-Mason also appears with us regularly as a concert presenter.

OUR BOARD

We currently have 10 Trustees, including a Derby City Council nominated Trustee.

These Trustees bring a wealth of professional and personal experience, and are based throughout the East Midlands.

The Board meets quarterly, in a hybrid in-person/online format. An annual in-person Board Away Day is held each year in either Derby or Nottingham. The Finance & General Purposes Sub-Committee meets quarterly, usually a week before each Board meeting.

Board members may also be invited to support specific working groups which align with their professional skill sets or personal interests. These are focussed task and finish groups which may also involve external advisors, musicians and members of staff.

Our Trustees attend Sinfonia Viva performances and events across the region, actively supporting our fundraising and awareness-raising campaigns, and advocating for our work locally and regionally.
